PRESCRIBED OFFERINGS

Church Planting Taskforce:

The Church Planting Taskforce aims to provide financial support for churches looking to start new congregations and to encourage new or potential church planters via networking and resourcing. The goal of this committee is to see the CRCA grow in the number of churches in Australia and to reach new communities that haven't been reached with the gospel before. Train Workgroup for Ministry Formation:

The TRAIN Workgroup exists to nurture, encourage, and inspire ministry training and leadership development across our denomination's churches--one part of our Four Fold Task. The members of the workgroup are drawn from across the country, and from a variety of contexts. They meet twice yearly to review what's already happening around our churches, share wisdom, and to figure out how we can work together to do even better in those areas in our local contexts. Solomon Islands Workgroup:

The Solomon Islands Workgroup oversees the running of the SWIM Base in the Solomon Islands. The SWIM Base is spiritual leadership training and equipping facility that reaches out to people right across the Solomon Islands. SWIM develops and delivers training courses focussed on ministry development, church leadership training, youth development, and many other courses. SWIM is also a conduit to connect the people of the CRCA to mission opportunities in the Solomon Islands. The Base also caters for local groups such as local churches for pastor training, youth groups, World Vision, WHO, Oxfam, SSEC Education Department, Ministry of Health – to name just a few.

The CRCA Prescribed Offering supports the work of SWIM by providing 50% of the budget to run the SWIM Base. The balance of funds comes from the people who use the facilities. SWIM Base is a well situated to facilitate local and international mission works within the Solomon Islands. MAMA Gift Account:

The Ministerial Aid & Mutual Assistance ("MAMA") offering goes towards the funding of gifts to CRCA churches. The churches can apply for funding with regards to paying for: a vicar, the cost of removal expenses for ministers and vicars, the establishment of new churches, the establishment of part-time ministry positions and for other special circumstances. The MAMA Gift Fund is administered by the CRCA's Business and Finance Committee. Contact the Synodical Administrator.

Candidacy Committee:

The CRCA Candidacy Committee has the responsibility of assisting men who are seeking ordained ministry in the CRCA through their time of study, until they are placed in a vicariate. This process involves receiving initial recommendations from their churches, consultation with the RTC regarding their course of study, regular contact with the candidate throughout their time of preparation, and ultimately placing them in a vicariate. The committee has representatives from each of the states, plus a Victorian executive.

RTC Overseas Student Fund:

They have put up with heat, long and arduous road trips and were able to communicate so well with a very different kind of students. Phillip Scheepers and Murray Capill were able to meet various members of the PTS staff while they were in India. Such face to face meetings/discussions are beneficial forums for exchanging ideas and information. E.g. CRFI/G.O.S.P.E.L. were challenged to give further consideration to ensuring elders are appointed in the churches



Cadets/GEMS:

Cadets is a Christian organisation, run by volunteers, with a programme that is created especially for Primary School boys from ages 9 to 14. At Cadets we aim to teach today youth about God, complete badge work, create crafts, play games, sing songs, make new friends and go on camps and outings.

G.E.M.S. is a Christian organisation, run by volunteers, with a programme that is created especially for girls from ages 9-15, with some groups also including a programme called Busy Bees for girls ages 6-8. The name G.E.M.S. stands for Girls Everywhere Meeting the Saviour. This name represents both the mission and vision of G.E.M.S. Girls' Clubs. The mission of G.E.M.S. is to help bring girls into a living, dynamic relationship with Jesus Christ. The vision of G.E.M.S. is to see girls actively and enthusiastically expressing love for God and others by equipping and encouraging them to live out their faith. At G.E.M.S. the girls learn about God, complete badge work, create crafts, play games, sing songs, make new friends and go on camps and outings.

Bible League Australia was founded with the support of the CRCA in 1970.

Gerald Hanscamp started the ministry here in Australia and was the founding National Director.

Our purpose statement is to serve the under-resourced Church globally through the provision of Bibles, biblical resources and training to transform lives worldwide through God's Word and help people meet Jesus.

We work in 50 countries around the world, with a focus on those who cannot afford or access a Bible. Our ministry includes:

- Project Philip (training in discipleship and evangelism based on the story in Acts 8)
- Bible-based Literacy (teaching adults and children to read and write using Bible-based text)
- Church Planter Training (Training of pastors to grow the Church)

Wycliffe Bible Translators:

Wycliffe Bible Translators Australia (WBTA) exists to see disciples of Jesus growing through the Scriptures available in the language that they understand best. To achieve this end WBTA is involved in the following activities:

- Promotion: presenting the work of Bible Translation to the Australian Christian public
- Advocacy: speaking out on behalf of language groups without adequate Scriptures
- Recruitment: inviting and encouraging Australian Christians to join the movement
- Training: providing appropriate and timely training to prepare people for roles in Bible translation
- Networking: working with churches and other mission organisations to further the work of Bible translation
- Empowering: supporting people in ways that allow them to work effectively
- Resourcing: cultivating resources, such as prayer and funding, to assist Bible translation around the world

WBTA is accredited with the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profit Commission and is a member of the Wycliffe Global Alliance which is a community of over 100 diverse organisations and networks serving together in Bible translation movements around the world. Middle East Reformed Fellowship:

Middle East Reformed Fellowship (MERF) is an evangelical Christian missionary organization which serves in the Middle East, North Africa and Asia on behalf of Reformed and Presbyterian Family of Churches and believers worldwide.

Our work is bearing fruit for the Kingdom of Christ among the twenty-two nations of the Arab League and other Muslim areas in Africa and Asia. Crossroads Prison Ministries:

Crossroads Prison Ministries operates in Australia and the South Pacific. Our primary function is to assist in the rehabilitation of prisoners in changing their lives by taking God's Word within the prison walls through our ongoing Correspondence Bible Study Courses. We are a faith-based organisation that does not receive any Government assistance and are totally depended on the generosity of our donors. We are bathed in prayer and trust wholly and completely in the Lord to supply all our needs

At Crossroads Prison Ministries we encourage inmates to commence our extensive correspondence bible study program and connect them with volunteer mentors in Christ centred relationships. The mentors review their completed bible study lesson and answer their questions. They share stories from their own lives and help their students see how God is speaking to them through His Word. Also, our mentors send a letter of encouragement and hope with every lesson. Crossroads Prison Ministries currently has more than 500 active inmate students and over 400 dedicated mentors across Australia. We are all about the good news of Jesus. Only Jesus can break the chains of the prisoners and bring true freedom to those that come to know Him.

International Justice Mission:

International Justice Mission (IJM) is the world's largest anti-slavery organisation. Since 1997 IJM has rescued over 76,000 people from slavery; IJM provides trauma informed care for those rescued for as long as that is required; they restrain the perpetrators of slavery by seeking their prosecution in courts of law, and they work with developing nation governments and law enforcement agencies to repair broken and ineffective justice systems. Their evidence based approach had yielded amazing results resulting in the protection of millions of otherwise vulnerable people. IJM does all this as a response to the Lord's command to 'seek justice and defend the oppressed' (Is 1:17).

The CRCA has supported the work of IJM through their recommended offerings since 2015. IJM has about 34 offices in about 24 countries, and are committed to continue this work to God's glory until all are free. More information can be found at www.IJM.org.au or by contacting:
