THE NATURE OF SIN

SUMMARY: This year has been one world catastrophe after another, things have been going wrong left right and centre. We can blame the bushfires on global warming and lockdowns on a virus, we can even say that racism is the fault of historical and institutional inequality. But are these things the real problem with this world? The Bible doesn't seem to think so, it says the problem is us.

According to 1 Timothy 1:15, each of us should consider ourselves as the worst of all sinners. The problem is, nobody likes to be called a sinner and no one likes to admit the darkness that lives within each of us. The problem isn't out in the world, the problem is us.

So, if we want to confront this issue, we need to understand it and to do that we need to turn to the Bible. This series will open up what has been historically known as the seven deadly sins. These seven sins are the attitudes and desires that lay behind our actions. They are a problem for all of us.

To help us understand these things and the challenge of sin in general, we will be focusing our readings on the book of Proverbs, a book of ancient wisdom.

This week, we set the foundation, not only in understanding sin but also in understanding the book of Proverbs. In these first 19 verses of the book, we see the importance of wisdom, the foundation of fear and an illustration of sin. Let's hope that in this series we can come to see just how great our God is for offering us forgiveness in Jesus!
